# GOSPEL: LUKE 2:1-14

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. <sup>2</sup>This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. <sup>3</sup>All went to their own towns to be registered. <sup>4</sup>Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. <sup>5</sup>He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. <sup>6</sup>While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. <sup>7</sup>And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

<sup>8</sup>In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. <sup>9</sup>Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. <sup>10</sup>But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: <sup>11</sup>to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. <sup>12</sup>This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." <sup>13</sup>And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, <sup>14</sup>"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

# CELEBRATION OF COMMUNITY THROUGH HOLY COMMUNION

# **CHRISTMAS EVE WORDS OF INSTITUTION**

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

For this sacred time, for this holy night, for the gift of incarnation, we give you our deepest thanks and highest praise, O God. In the fullness of your time, you came to us an infant, confounding the wise and encouraging the faithful, so that you might know us and live as us; teach us, heal us, and save us. May your Spirit come to us now, and settle upon this bread and cup, that they might become for us the spiritual presence of the body and blood of Christ.

Just as Jesus' birth was for the whole world, this bread and wine is for everyone: For the hungry, for the lost, for those who search, and those who have found; for those who question and those who know peace.

And, so, we come, remembering that on the night in which he gave himself up for the world, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to those gathered, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the promise of forgiveness in my blood, poured out for you and for all people. Do this in remembrance of me.

As we share this feast, may we be fed with grace and courage, with hope and joy, strengthened to go out into the world as messengers of your Good News, united in the hope that is ours in the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us;

and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

This is, indeed, our Lord's Table, where all are truly welcomed and nourished in love. If you wish to receive a blessing without the bread and wine, please come forward, indicating your desire by crossing your arms over your chest.
