### WELCOME & GREETING

#### CALL TO WORSHIP

God's saving word is for all people.

**We do not get to decide who is included.**

Let us give thanks that God welcomes everyone.

**Thank you, God, for welcoming us!**

#### CONFESSION

We confess our sins before God and one another.

*(Pause for silence and reflection.)*

**God of new life, we live as though you are still in the grave. We do not rejoice in the good news of liberation for all people without exception. We continue to sin against you and our neighbors by our actions and our failure to act. Shake us out of our complacency, cleanse our hearts of selfishness, and make us joyful participants in the work of bringing about your reign in the world today.**

#### WORDS OF ASSURANCE

We are an Easter people! Through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God has redeemed all of creation. As a called and ordained minister in the church of Christ, and by his power, I declare to you that you are made whole, forgiven of all your sins, and empowered to live out the gospel in joy. **Amen.**

#### PRAYER OF THE DAY

Gracious God, **whether we are aware of it or not, we often put up barriers, deciding for ourselves who is "in" and who is "out" of your righteous reign. Shake us out of our need to control, and open our hearts to accept all people without exception, as you do. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.**

## **FIRST READING: ACTS 15:1-18**

**Lector:** Then certain individuals came down from Judea and were teaching the brothers, Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved. And after Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and debate with them, Paul and Barnabas and some of the others were appointed to go up to Jerusalem to discuss this question with the apostles and the elders. So they were sent on their way by the church, and as they passed through both Phoenicia and Samaria, they reported the conversion of the Gentiles, and brought great joy to all the believers.

**Pastor:** When they came to Jerusalem, they were welcomed by the church and the apostles and the elders, and they reported all that God had done with them. But some believers who belonged to the sect of the Pharisees stood up and said, It is necessary for them to be circumcised and ordered to keep the law of Moses.

**Lector:** The apostles and the elders met together to consider this matter. After there had been much debate, Peter stood up and said to them, My brothers, you know that in the early days God made a choice among you, that I should be the one through whom the Gentiles would hear the message of the good news and become believers. And God, who knows the human heart, testified to them by giving them the Holy Spirit, just as he did to us; and in cleansing their hearts by faith he has made no distinction between them and us. Now therefore why are you putting God to the test by placing on the neck of the disciples a yoke that neither our ancestors nor we have been able to bear? On the contrary, we believe that we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they will.

**Pastor:** The whole assembly kept silence, and listened to Barnabas and Paul as they told of all the signs and wonders that God had done through them among the Gentiles. After they finished speaking, James replied,

**Lector:** My brothers, listen to me. Simeon has related how God first looked favorably on the Gentiles, to take from among them a people for his name. This agrees with the words of the prophets, as it is written, "After this I will return, and I will rebuild the dwelling of David, which has fallen; from its ruins I will rebuild it, and I will set it up, so that all other peoples may seek the Lord – even all the Gentiles over whom my name has been called. Thus says the Lord, who has been making these things known from long ago."

Word of God. Word of Life. **Thanks be to God.**

## **HOLY GOSPEL: LUKE 2:29-32**

<sup>29</sup>"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; <sup>30</sup>for my eyes have seen your salvation, <sup>31</sup>which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, <sup>32</sup>a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

This is the Gospel of our Lord. **Praise to you, O Christ.**

**RESPONSE TO THE WORD**

People of God, do you promise to support Kaiya and pray for her in her new life in Christ?

**People: We do.**

## PROFESSION OF FAITH

**Assisting Minister:** With the whole church, let us confess our faith.

Do you believe in God the Father?

**All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**All: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.**

## THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

**Pastor Janet:** The Lord be with you.

**All: And also with you.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight.

Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your Living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

Kaiya Ellen, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

**All: You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized. Alleluia.**

Be with those who mourn this day, especially John and Caroline, Eric, Everett Pearl, and the family and friends of Matt. Make us a source of comfort, love, and strength to them as they face the days ahead. Bring them peace as they trust in the knowledge that he rests in Your loving arms. Holy and wonderful God, **receive our prayer.**

Comfort and sustain all who journey with ongoing health challenges especially Pastor Phil, Scott, Rick and Kelly, Terry Schreier, Jim and Sally, Dave, Dorothy, Clover, and all those we lift through our Prayer Chain. Guide their caregivers and medical providers, grant patience and acceptance to their loved ones, and bring peace to troubled hearts. Holy and wonderful God, **receive our prayer.**

We pray for all peoples to heed your call for justice, mercy, and compassion. Incline the hearts of the leaders of our country to align with your vision for justice and mercy. We pray for the work of the Joshua School and organizations like them. Empower those who nurture the minds, bodies and spirits of children and adults living on the Autism Spectrum. Help us to help them reach their fullest potential. Holy and wonderful God, **receive our prayer.**

We pray for the nations now engaged in war, especially Ukraine and Gaza. In the steadfastness of your love, hasten the day of peace. Look with mercy on those exposed to hatred, conflict, and death. In your mercy, remove all causes and occasions of war. Incline the hearts of all people to follow the path to peace and justice, that war may cease and reconciliation may come. Holy and wonderful God, **receive our prayer.**

May we honor those saints who have gone before us by continuing the walk of faith, that others might follow after us, continuing the chain of community in Christ. Holy and wonderful God, **receive our prayer.**

These and the prayers of all creation we lift to you in Jesus' name.

### THE THANKSGIVING

It is a right, good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth. You brought all things into being and called them good. From the dust of the earth you formed us into your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away in denial, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast. You made us your covenant people, and your ways are just and true.

Most Holy & Gracious God, we pray not only for ourselves, but for others – known and unknown, named & unnamed – from whose lives health or happiness has fled. Bring them your comfort and peace that surpasses understanding.

Bless our world, O Lord, and by your Spirit let your harmony and justice prevail. Bless our church, uniting us in the truth of your Word and empowering us in ministry to the world. Bless our family and friends, watching over and providing peace to them. Bless all who are suffering by embracing them in your loving arms. Bless each person here this morning, keeping us all faithful to you.

### WORDS OF INSTITUTION

Remembering your gracious acts in Jesus Christ, we take this bread and cup and joyfully celebrate Christ's dying and rising. As we await the day of his coming, we remember that on the night in which he gave himself up for the world, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and drink; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for all people for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."

With thanksgiving, we offer ourselves to you as a living and holy sacrifice, dedicated to your service. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world, and guide us with the prayer that Jesus gave us:

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;  
and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.**

Jesus, who is for all people regardless of origin, invites every single person without exception to this holy meal in his name. Join your siblings throughout the world in the bread and wine that is Jesus present with us, and be united into the Body of Christ now and forever.

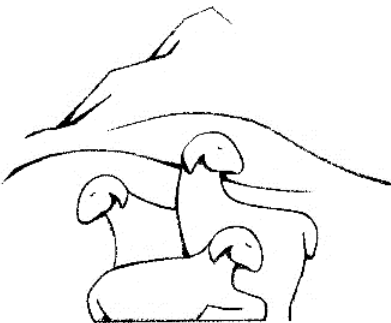
