SCRIPTURE READINGS: FIRST READING: ISAIAH 55: 1-13

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. 2Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. ³Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David. 4See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. ⁵See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you. ⁶Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near; ⁷let the wicked forsake their way, and the unrighteous their thoughts; let them return to the Lord, that he may have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon. 8For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. 9For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. ¹⁰For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, ¹¹so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it. ¹²For you shall go out in joy, and be led back in peace; the mountains and the hills before you shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands. ¹³Instead of the thorn shall come up the cypress; instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle; and it shall be to the Lord for a memorial, for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off.

HOLY GOSPEL: JOHN 4:13-14

¹³Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life."

This is the Gospel of our Lord.

REFLECTION BY ASSISTING MINISTER DICK WERPY

In Isaiah 55, God speaks to a people who feel drained, discouraged, and far from home in Babylon. The Israelites in exile had lost much of what gave them hope—yet God invites them to come and receive everything they truly need "without money and without cost." This chapter is a powerful reminder that God's grace isn't something we earn; it is a gift offered freely to all who are thirsty for His presence. Even when life feels confusing or uncertain, God assures us that His ways are higher than ours and His plans are unfolding even when we cannot see them.

The Lord calls His people to seek Him, promising compassion, forgiveness, and restoration. Just as rain brings life to dry ground, God's word brings life to dry and discouraged hearts. His promises are not empty; they accomplish exactly what He intends. For the exiles, this meant returning home. For us, it means trusting that God's grace will continue to transform and renew us. When we turn to Him, He meets us with open arms, ready to restore what has been broken.

Isaiah ends with a beautiful picture of joy and renewal — mountains singing, trees clapping, and thorns giving way to cypress and myrtle. It's a vision of what happens when God's grace takes root in our lives. The sorrow of the past is replaced with the joy of God's future. Even in our hardest seasons, God promises that His word will bring hope, healing, and new life. Isaiah 55 reminds us that God's grace not only sustains us but also leads us into a future filled with joy. This invitation in Isaiah connects beautifully with Jesus' words in John 4:13–14. When Jesus speaks to the Samaritan woman at the well, He offers her "living water" that will never run dry — a direct echo of God's invitation to the thirsty in Isaiah 55. Both passages show that God provides freely and abundantly what our souls most deeply need. The living water Jesus offers is the fulfillment of the grace proclaimed in Isaiah: a life renewed, a heart restored, and joy that overflows into eternity.
