SCRIPTURE READINGS: MARK 9: 34-35

³⁴ But they were silent, for on the way they had argued with one another who was the greatest. ³⁵ He sat down, called the twelve, and said to them, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all."



ACTS 18: 1-4

After this Paul left Athens and went to Corinth. ²There he found a Jew named Aquila, a native of Pontus, who had recently come from Italy with his wife Priscilla, because Claudius had ordered all Jews to leave Rome. Paul went to see them, ³ and, because he was of the same trade, he stayed with them, and they worked together — by trade they were tentmakers. ⁴Every sabbath he would argue in the synagogue and would try to convince Jews and Greeks.

1 CORINTHIANS 1: 10-18

¹⁰ Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. ¹¹ For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters. ¹² What I mean is that each of you says, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ." ¹³ Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴ I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵ so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶ (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷ For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL BY ASSISTING MINISTER JOHN YARBERRY

"For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." This last verse from our gospel reading deserves scrutiny. How can the message about the cross be foolishness? There are many that believe Christ died so that those who believe in him will become more prosperous, have better bigger houses, the job of their dreams, and money overflowing. In other words, "blessed." God will do these things for them if they follow the rules, and all that you must do is ask. This is commonly referred to as prosperity gospel.

The falsehood perpetrated here is antithetical to Christ's teachings and the life he lived as an example for all humankind. The theology of the cross, a term coined by Martin Luther, in contrast is one of suffering and service. Jesus died so that we could live with the promise of forgiveness, and eternal life. Jesus made the ultimate sacrifice by his death on the cross, and glorious resurrection. A mean, cruel, and humiliating death. This theology is foolishness to those who are in fact living lives thinking Christ died for their material and ego driven needs. Those that they see suffering hardships are viewed as if they must have something in their life that God does not like or have made mistakes that God is punishing them for.

Martin Luther wrote the following about the theology of the cross: "One deserves to be called a theologian, however, who comprehends the visible and manifest things of God seen through suffering and the cross.... A theologian of glory calls evil good and good evil. A theologian of the cross calls the thing what it actually is" (Heidelberg Disputation, theses 20 and 21).

With gratitude we remember all peacemakers throughout history who have united and strengthened the body of Christ by their calm guidance. May we, in turn, bring peace and unity to our own faith community. God of new life, **hear our prayer.**

We place in your arms all for whom we pray, out loud or in our hearts, confident in your mercy and grace, through Jesus Christ, our savior. Amen.
